

This one-day workshop is designed for experienced knitters only. Students must be able to cast on, knit, purl, and bind off.



### AMERICAN RED CROSS LIFEGUARD

### Lifeguard Certification w/CPR HM-288

The primary purpose of the American Red Cross Lifequarding course is to provide entry-level lifeguard participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies and to provide professional-level care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries and sudden illnesses until emergency medical services (EMS) personnel take over.

Prerequisites: Minimum age: 15 years; Swim 300 yards continuously; Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs; Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds by starting in the water, swimming 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, exit the water without using steps or a ladder. Participants who successfully complete the Lifequarding course receive an American Red Cross certificate for Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED, valid for 2 years.

Lunch & Learn: How Pesticides May Affect Your Health PI-967

Friday, October 20 • 12:00pm-1:00pm • Via Zoom

Fresh produce items generally lack pesticide labeling, leaving consumers unaware of the pesticide residue content that remains on both conventional and organic produce. A 2022 study identified and discussed pervasive health hazards related to residual pesticides on the food we consume. Pesticides and other synthetic chemicals are persistently present in our food, air, soil and water systems, making them nearly impossible to avoid. The session will focus primarily on the health dangers of pesticides and strategies to reduce your exposure to them. This is a 45-minute presentation with a 15-minute Q & A.

### Maximizing Nutrition from Whole Plant Sources PI-968

Ever wonder which plants contain particular vitamins and minerals? This evening program will present the nutrients contained in a variety of fruits and vegetables, so that you can plan your meals with a focus on maximizing nutritional benefits. This is a 45-minute presentation with a 15-minute Q & A.



Courses taught by Mary Carolyn Thies who recently completed her PhD in Health Science and has a Master of Science in Clinical Nutrition and Integrative Health. She is a former adjunct professor at University of Maryland, as well as at George combined both health and statistics; she was a senior

statistician for the U.S. Department of Transportation/Federal Aviation Administration, human spaceflight safety program, and for the Turner Fairbank Highway Research Center. For DOT/FAA, she worked on the Informed Consent program and human spaceflight safety database for human spaceflight tourism customers (SpaceX and Blue Origin launches). For Federal Highway, she personally conducted distracted driving experiments and tested what is currently now the common "city safety"

# FIREARMS Training & Certification





All firearm courses are taught by John W Sagal, USAF Veteran, MSP Retired, and owner of Boston Hill Training. Sagal is a certified Maryland State Police Qualified Handgun Instructor and an NRA certified firearms instructor.

### Handgun Qualification License:

This Handgun Qualification License training is a five-hour block of instruction which includes classroom instruction on state firearm law, home firearm safety, handgun mechanisms and operation, and a component that requires the applicant demonstrate the ability to safely fire a handgun. Unless otherwise exempt, as of October 1, 2013, a Maryland Resident must possess a valid Handgun Qualification License before they may purchase, rent, or receive a handgun. The classroom portion of the course will occur at 79 Grant Street in Frostburg MD and the operation and handling demonstration will occur at a secure firing range. The extra time built into the course will allow for travel to the range. Students must be a minimum of 21 years of age and are not permitted to bring a weapon or ammunition to class. Additional charge for fingerprinting done on site.

Approved HQL training courses are offered by Maryland State Police approved Qualified Handgun Instructors. Training is valid for 3 years and must be completed prior to submitting an application for a Handgun Qualification License. The Handgun Qualification License is only needed for purchasing, transferring, or renting a regulated firearm after October 1, 2013. You do not need a Handgun Qualification License to own a gun you already have.

#### **NRA Basic Rifle:**

This course is designed to teach the knowledge, skills and attitude necessary for owning and using a rifle safely. The course is perfect for the new rifle owner and serves as an introductory course for more advanced hunting or competition rifle match training. The basics of marksmanship are the lifelong building blocks for many other hunting or shooting sports. The goal of the basic rifle course is to familiarize the student with the correct operation and maintenance all types of rifles, along with teaching how to handle and shoot them safely. Topics include the following: gun safety, operation of different types of rifles, ammunition knowledge, rifle selection, storage and the five shooting fundamentals. Classroom instruction will be held at the Garrett College facility. Students will then provide their own transportation to complete live fire training and a shooting qualification on NRA approved targets at a range in Frostburg, MD. Students will receive the rifle handbook and a course completion certificate. All materials will be provided by instructor and are included in the cost of the course. STUDENTS ARE NOT TO BRING AMMUNITION OR FIREARMS. Students will sign a waiver of liability and are to provide their own lunch. Any person of good character who is not legally disqualified from possessing a rifle in the U.S. can attend this class. A paying adult must accompany individuals under the age of 18 years of age.

### Maryland Firearm Wear & Carry Training:

This 2-day class is required for anyone applying for the initial MD Wear & Carry Permit. Topics include: handgun nomenclature and operation, handgun action types, rules for safe firearm handling and use, fundamentals of handgun shooting, introduction to MD firearms laws, use of lethal force, selection/maintenance/storage of a handgun, home safety, interactions with law enforcement, and application requirements and process. Students should bring the firearm they will qualify with and 25 rounds of ammo to keep locked in trunk until arrival on range. Attendance of class does not guarantee permit. Additional charge for fingerprinting done on site.

Wounded Knee, South Dakota is the site of the last battle between the American Indians and the U.S. Army. The title of this class is taken from the iconic book by Dee Brown. Author/Historian James McPherson has observed that "The wars in Vietnam and Afghanistan have vied for designation as America's longest war, but the uninterrupted succession of armed conflicts between the U.S. Army and Indians on the Great Plains and the Rocky Mountains from 1860 to 1890 were truly America's longest and most tragic war." This class will explore the history of the American Indians, focusing particularly on the thirty-year military conflict from 1860 to 1890 which culminated in the "Massacre at Wounded Knee" in 1890.

This course allows for individual studies in piano and music theory for beginning, intermediate, and advanced students. Beginning students will develop music reading skills and basic piano technique. Intermediate and advanced students will further develop their technique through scales and etudes and explore a variety of piano literature. Students must have access to a piano or electric keyboard to practice assignments on a daily basis. The age range for the course is 5 years old and up. Sessions will be in ten, half-hour individualized segments by appointment. Prior to registration, the student will need to meet with Dr. Beachy to discuss his/her proficiency.

#### Voice Lessons PD-899

This course is designed for individual studies in the training of vocal activities related to singing. Beginning students will learn correct posture and breathing, tone production, diction, sight singing, notation reading, ear training and general principles of vocalizing. Intermediate students will develop their vocal technique, sighting ability, and performance quality through appropriate vocal exercises and literature. All students will sing a variety of genres including classical pieces, musical theatre, art songs, folk songs and pop/rock. Students preparing for college entrance auditions will memorize and apply the International Phonetic Alphabet and perform songs in Italian, French and German. The age range for this course is 7 years old to adult. Sessions will be in ten, half-hour segments by appointment.

Most recently, his work for concert band, Fanfare for an Uncommon Band, was premiered by the Garrett Community Concert Band, of which he is the director, in June 2022 celebrating the band's 20 th anniversary. Along with his wife, Debi, he directs the Garrett Choral Society and is the director of the Garrett Jazz Ensemble. In addition, he is co-director of music at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Oakland.

Dr. Beachy currently teaches Piano Studies, Voice, Electric Bass Guitar, and Composition/Songwriting for the Music Enthusiast. Lessons with him are offered at the Northern Outreach Center (NOC), Southern Outreach Center (SOC), and at the college main campus in the Performing Arts Center.

Emily Foreman, from Frostburg,
Maryland, is a flutist and pianist with
training in both classical and jazz
music. She currently teaches
private flute and piano lessons
while studying for a Music
Performance Degree at Frostburg
State University. She is a member of
the FSU Wind Ensemble, FSU Jazz

Combo, FSU Jazz Orchestra, and FSU Chamber Singers.
She studies with flutist Dr. Eftihia Arkoudis, and previously studied with flutist Dr. Keith Hanlon. Emily has performed in masterclasses with successful flutists such as Kim Valerio (principal flutist of both the Annapolis Symphony and Maryland Symphony Orchestras), and composer Hadar Noiberg, Emilio Rutllant, and Beatriz Macias. She previously studied piano and composition with Dr. Sean Beachy, then studied piano with Dr. James DeWire, and currently studies jazz piano with Tom Harrison. Emily has performed with local groups such as







All workforce programs require a \$25 non-refundable application fee which cannot be paid with scholarship funds. The student is also responsible for any program fees, tests. or materials which are not covered by his/her scholarship.

### Drop Policy

It is the student's responsibility to withdraw from a course that he/she cannot attend. Please note that failure to attend at least 75% of the course sessions, or failure to complete assigned coursework, may result in the termination of funding; as a result, the student will be charged for the entire cost of the course.





# **INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY**

Continuing Education and Workforce Development follows the Garrett College Inclement Weather Policy.

### WHEN ARE WEATHER-RELATED DECISIONS MADE?

Because weather and road conditions can change quickly, there is no fixed time by which a decision to delay or close is made. While we attempt to make decisions for all-day closings and delayed openings by 6:30 AM, you should always consider the possibility that the decision may come after that time. Decisions to close early are made based upon information about the conditions, which means that there is no set time that these decisions will be made either; however, the College attempts to have a decision made about closing early by 3:00 PM.

# HOW DO I FIND OUT IF THERE IS A DELAY OR CLOSING FOR THE COLLEGE?

### HOW DO I KNOW WHICH LOCATION IS CLOSED?

Announcements made that the College is closed due to weather conditions include all locations: McHenry campus, Northern Outreach Center (Grantsville), Career and Technical Training Center (Accident), and the Southern Outreach Center (Oakland). There may be times when a particular location is delayed or closed for reasons other than weather. The information that is disseminated at that time will specify which location(s) are affected.

Employees, students and the public should not call any college department to find out whether the college is closed or is going to close. We ask that you call the weather-line for closing or delayed opening information. Note: The College will not make an announcement if operating on a regular schedule. If no information has been posted, then the College will be operating as normal.
