



NEW! DIY: Learn to Weave an Egg Basket PI-930

Interested in weaving? Join us to learn how to make an egg basket, also known as a buttocks, melon, gizzard, bow, peanut, or fanny basket. These baskets can be used to carry produce, pine cones, garden tools, wild flowers, and more, but have become popular for carrying eggs due to the unique shaped bottom that prevents eggs from rolling around. Students will need to bring the following items for weaving: a small awl, scissors, clothes pins, dish pan, towel, measuring tape, and a pocket or carrying knife.

NEW! T-SHIRT BLEACH ART

T-shirt Bleach Art PI-938
Join us as we create a work of art on a t-shirt using bleach!
First class: We will discuss different methods of applying the bleach solution, and the effects that each creates, including adding back in some color. Students will plan and draw their own designs to be copied onto their t-shirts in the second class.





Second class: Students will set up their supplies, prepare their shirts, and "paint" the design they chose onto the shirt. When finished, they will bathe the shirt in a solution that will stop the bleach action and set the design.

At the end of the second class, each student will have completed a shirt of original design, unique to their own interests and style.

STUDENTS WILL NEED TO BRING THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. A dark-colored t-shirt, 80% 100% cotton. It needs to be washed and dried with NO fabric softener
- 2. A plastic dishpan or tub of some sort, that will hold the t-shirt with extra space for rinsing
- 3. A plastic measuring cup that holds a couple of cups of liquid, and is NOT used for food

AMERICAN RED CROSS LIFEGUARD

Lifeguard Certification w/CPR HM-288

The primary purpose of the American Red Cross Lifeguarding course is to provide entry-level lifeguard participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize and respond to aquatic emergencies and to provide professional-level care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries and sudden illnesses until emergency medical services (EMS) personnel take over.

Prerequisites: Minimum age: 15 years; Swim 300 yards continuously; Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs; Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds by starting in the water, swimming 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, exit the water without using steps or a ladder. Participants who successfully complete the Lifeguarding course receive an American Red Cross certificate for Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED, valid for 2 years.

Maryland Basic Boating Safety PD-07

The Maryland Basic Boating Course is packed full of the basic information you need to boat safely and enjoy your time on the water. What are the rules of the road when there is no road? Find out the latest laws regarding personal floatation devices, required safety equipment, operating personal watercraft and towing procedures. Practice some chart reading and review the channel marker system in coastal waters. Individuals born after June 1, 1972 are required to have an approved Boaters Safety card in their possession when operating a power boat in Maryland. Successful completion of this course will provide that card in one day. The course is open to those 12 years of age and over and parents and grandparents taking the course as a refresher are welcome! Boater Safety is Family Safety! Students receive their class book at the time of registration and must bring their text to class with completed pre-test and guizzes.

BABYSITTING CERTIFICATION

Interested in babysitting or starting your own babysitting business?

This course will get you certified and on your way!

The American Red Cross Babysitter's Training course is to provide youth who are planning to babysit with the knowledge and skills necessary to safely and responsibly give care for children and infants. This training will help participants to develop leadership skills; learn how to develop a babysitting business, keep themselves and others safe and help children behave; and learn about basic child care and basic first aid. This training is designed for youths ages 11 to 15.

Upon Completion of this course, you will receive an American Red Cross Certification Valid for 3 years in Babysitting with basic first aid and child CPR. This course is approximately 9 hours and is taught by Angela Luby.



FIREARINS Training & Certification



All firearm courses are taught by John W Sagal, USAF Veteran, MSP Retired, and owner of Boston Hill Training. Sagal is a certified Maryland State Police Qualified Handgun Instructor and an NRA certified firearms instructor.

Handgun Qualification License:

This Handgun Qualification License training is a five-hour block of instruction which includes classroom instruction on state firearm law, home firearm safety, handgun mechanisms and operation, and a component that requires the applicant demonstrate the ability to safely fire a handgun. Unless otherwise exempt, as of October 1, 2013, a Maryland Resident must possess a valid Handgun Qualification License before they may purchase, rent, or receive a handgun. The classroom portion of the course will occur at 79 Grant Street in Frostburg MD and the operation and handling demonstration will occur at a secure firing range. The extra time built into the course will allow for travel to the range. Students must be a minimum of 21 years of age and are not permitted to bring a weapon or ammunition to class. Additional charge for fingerprinting done on site.

Approved HQL training courses are offered by Maryland State Police approved Qualified Handgun Instructors. Training is valid for 3 years and must be completed prior to submitting an application for a Handgun Qualification License. The Handgun Qualification License is only needed for purchasing, transferring, or renting a regulated firearm after October 1, 2013. You do not need a Handgun Qualification License to own a gun you already have.

NRA Basic Rifle:

This course is designed to teach the knowledge, skills and attitude necessary for owning and using a rifle safely. The course is perfect for the new rifle owner and serves as an introductory course for more advanced hunting or competition rifle match training. The basics of marksmanship are the lifelong building blocks for many other hunting or shooting sports. The goal of the basic rifle course is to familiarize the student with the correct operation and maintenance all types of rifles, along with teaching how to handle and shoot them safely. Topics include the following: gun safety, operation of different types of rifles, ammunition knowledge, rifle selection, storage and the five shooting fundamentals. Classroom instruction will be held at the Garrett College facility. Students will then provide their own transportation to complete live fire training and a shooting qualification on NRA approved targets at a range in Frostburg, MD. Students will receive the rifle handbook and a course completion certificate. All materials will be provided by instructor and are included in the cost of the course. STUDENTS ARE NOT TO BRING AMMUNITION OR FIREARMS. Students will sign a waiver of liability and are to provide their own lunch. Any person of good character who is not legally disqualified from possessing a rifle in the U.S. can attend this class. A paying adult must accompany individuals under the age of 18 years of age.

Maryland Firearm Wear & Carry Training:

This 2-day class in required for anyone applying for the initial MD Wear & Carry Permit. Topics include: handgun nomenclature and operation, handgun action types, rules for safe firearm handling and use, fundamentals of handgun shooting, introduction to MD firearms laws, use of lethal force, selection/maintenance/storage of a handgun, home safety, interactions with law enforcement, and application requirements and process. Students should bring the firearm they will qualify with and 25 rounds of ammo to keep locked in trunk until arrival on range. Attendance of class does not guarantee permit. Additional charge for fingerprinting done on site.

Wilderness First Responder AS-07

SOLO's Wilderness First Responder (WFR) course is the recognized industry standard for those who work as backcountry trip leaders, camp counselors, mountain guides, river guides, and ski patrollers. The WFR is the perfect course for anyone working in a position of leadership in an outdoor setting or for individuals who want a high level of wilderness medical training for extended personal backcountry trips or expeditions. The WFR training is 72+ hours long (8 to 10 days), and is a comprehensive and in-depth look at the standards and skills of dealing with: Response and Assessment, Musculoskeletal Injuries, Environmental Emergencies and Survival Skills, Soft Tissue Injuries, and Medical Emergencies. Although these appear to be the same basic topics covered in our two-day WFA course, they are covered far more extensively, and there is much more hands-on practice. Additional topics, such as CPR, are also included.

Introduction to Rock Climbing PI-944

This course is designed to introduce students to the basic skills and concepts associated with all disciplines of rock climbing. Emphasis will be given to top rope climbing and following a lead climber in a traditional multi-pitch rock climbing setting. Skills and concepts associated with bouldering, sport climbing, and aid climbing will also be presented. The course meets at the Center for Adventure and Outdoor Studies at Garrett College each day and then travels to climbing sites, including but not limited to: Coopers Rock, Seneca Rocks, Nelson Rocks, Fork Run Recreation Area, and Gritstone Climbing and Fitness. NEW! The American Revolution 1760-1787 PI-928

In 1760, inhabitants of the North American Colonies were proud of their British citizenship, and thought the British system of government was the best in the world. Fifteen years later, these same colonists came to blows with British regular troops at Lexington and Concord, setting off a conflict that resulted in the colonies ultimately declaring their independence from Britain. Soon after achieving victory on the battlefield, these colonists met in Philadelphia to establish a constitution that created the United States of America. This course will explore the complex convergence of circumstances that led to this separation, the ensuing war, and the creation of a new revolutionary republic. This course is taught by Dick Carroll who holds a Master of Arts Degree (2004) in American History from George Mason University. Before earning his MS Degree, he served for over forty years with the Central Intelligence Agency and the National Reconnaissance Office in various capacities. He has been teaching courses on American History since 2005 at various colleges and is excited to be teaching in Garrett County once more.

Railroads of Garrett County: A History PI-676

In this class major focus will be on the building of the B & O Railroad and its impact in Garrett County from the middle of the 19th Century to well into the 20th Century. It will briefly describe effects of the Civil War under the presidency of John W. Garrett for whom Garrett County is named. It will cover five railroads in general terms for class participants with even a mild interest in rail travel. For this class, historian, author, and educator, Dr. Neal Brooks will describe the railroads development, decline, and main purposes. We will discuss two major companies, the B & O and Western Maryland, with remnants that are still present as part of CSX Corp. We will also cover smaller coal/logging railroads that disappeared but had significant impact including the Confluence and Oakland, Preston Railroad, and the Jennings Brothers Railroad. An added capsule will briefly explain the functions of steam and diesel locomotives in general terms. This class is intended for a general audience interested in Garrett County and in general rail transportation history, not just rail fans. In addition, this class has the added dimension in meeting in the renovated 1884 B&O Railroad station, one of the most significant historic buildings in Oakland, MD.

Garrett College's Continuing Education & Workforce Development division awards over \$100,000 in scholarships annually as a result of funding from Garrett County Commissioners, local agencies, and donors through the Garrett College Foundation. Drop Policy





INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Continuing Education and Workforce Development follows the Garrett College Inclement Weather Policy.

WHEN ARE WEATHER-RELATED DECISIONS MADE?

Because weather and road conditions can change quickly, there is no fixed time by which a decision to delay or close is made. While we attempt to make decisions for all-day closings and delayed openings by 6:30 AM, you should always consider the possibility that the decision may come after that time. Decisions to close early are made based upon information about the conditions, which means that there is no set time that these decisions will be made either; however, the College attempts to have a decision made about closing early by 3:00 PM.

HOW DO I KNOW WHICH LOCATION IS CLOSED?

Announcements made that the College is closed due to weather conditions include all locations: McHenry campus, Northern Outreach Center (Grantsville), Career and Technical Training Center (Accident), and the Southern Outreach Center (Oakland). There may be times when a particular location is delayed or closed for reasons other than weather. The information that is disseminated at that time will specify which location(s) are affected.

Employees, students and the public should not call any college department to find out whether the college is closed or is going to close. We ask that you call the weather-line for closing or delayed opening information. Note: The College will not make an announcement if operating on a regular schedule. If no information has been posted, then the College will be operating as normal.
