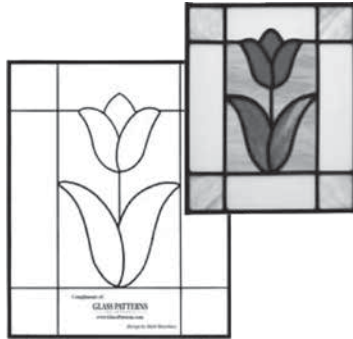

In this workshop, you will learn the centuries-old technique of creating colorful, radiant art with your own two hands. Through guided instruction across six 90-minute sessions, you'll explore glass types, tools, and techniques for cutting, grinding, foiling, and soldering. By the end of the course, you'll leave with a beautiful, 6x8 inch, custom-made piece that captures the light and reflects your personal creativity.

What you'll learn:

- How to safely cut and shape glass pieces
- The copper foil (Tiffany) method for assembly
- Proper soldering techniques
- How to frame, finish and polish your creation.



Student Requirements: Ages 14 and up. No open-toed shoes or shorts.

Students will need to bring the following items: safety goggles, household scissors, thin work gloves, latex gloves, a few band-aids, and an apron or old shirt. All other supplies will be provided, with the sharing of hand tools. Full attendance is strongly recommended. This course is designed for absolute beginners with a willingness to learn! The wall basket is woven with both flat and flat oval reed using basic weaving techniques. A heavy-duty bushel handle allows the finished basket to hang from a peg or hook, while the flat bottom ensures it can also sit neatly on a level surface. To personalize their work, students may add a woven color highlight, with several shades of pre-dyed reed available to choose from. Students will need to bring the following items for weaving: a small awl, scissors, clothespins, dishpan, towel, measuring tape, and a pocket or carrying knife.

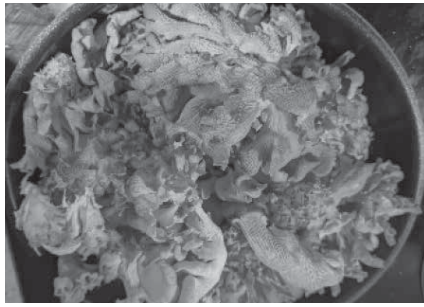

AMERICAN RED CROSS LIFEGUARD

Lifeguard Certification w/CPR HM-288

The primary purpose of the American Red Cross Lifeguarding course is to provide entry-level lifeguard participants with the knowledge and skills to prevent, recognize, and respond to aquatic emergencies and to provide professional-level care for breathing and cardiac emergencies, injuries and sudden illnesses until emergency medical services (EMS) personnel take over. Prerequisites: Minimum age: 15 years; Swim 300 yards continuously; Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs; Complete a timed event within 1 minute and 40 seconds by starting in the water, swimming 20 yards, surface dive to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point, exit the water without using steps or a ladder. Participants who successfully complete the Lifeguarding course receive an American Red Cross certificate for Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED, valid for 2 years.

NOTE: The Lifeguard courses have an online blended learning component that will need to be completed the week prior to class. Courses are taught at the CARC in McHenry and instructed by Angela Luby.

- Butterfly: 15 yards

The program is for current, active rock climbers who have a real desire to teach rock climbing to novices in a single pitch setting. The SPI Course is a 27-hour training course that normally runs as three consecutive nine-hour days or day classes with evening sessions. The SPI Assessment (offered separately) is a minimum of 16 hours run over a two-day period. Certification (earned by passing the SPI Assessment) lasts for three years as long as the candidate keeps current AMGA Membership and appropriate First Aid Certification. After three years current SPI's can re-take the SPI Assessment to regain the SPI certification. Successfully completing or passing any higher-level AMGA Course also recertifies the SPI certification for another three years.

Course Prerequisites:

- You are a Professional Member of the AMGA. Please obtain your AMGA Professional Membership before registering for this course!
- You have a genuine interest in rock climbing and instructing novices on single pitch crags.
- You are at least 18 years old at the time of the course.
- You have at least 12 months prior climbing experience.
- You are an active climber with traditional lead climbing experience (leader placing pro).
- You have led a minimum of 15 traditional rock climbing routes (any grade).
- You are capable of comfortably climbing 5.8 while on a top rope.

The above prerequisites are absolute minimums. Without having at least this amount experience, you are unlikely to make best use of the training. This course will be held in the Coopers Rock State Forest and the surrounding area.

Dr. Beachy currently teaches Piano Studies, Voice, Electric Bass Guitar, and Composition/Songwriting for the Music Enthusiast. Lessons with him are offered at the Northern Outreach Center (NOC), Southern Outreach Center (SOC), and at the college main campus in the Performing Arts Center.

Garrett College offers in partnership with George Brown College online technician programs in Automation, Electric Vehicle, Electromechanical, Electronics, PLC and PLC II and Robotics. These programs provide a self-paced online option for students looking to develop their skill-set in the respective discipline. The cornerstone of these programs is the simulation software, which is fully integrated within the learning material and bridges the gap between theoretical and practical usage. The simulation software includes LogixSim for automation simulation, CircuitLogix, 3DLab for electronics and electromechanical simulation, RoboLogix for robotics simulation and LogixPro and PLCLogix for PLC simulation.



Individuals who graduate from these programs of study have the entry level skills required to succeed in traditional and growing markets.

All workforce programs require a \$25 non-refundable application fee which cannot be paid with scholarship funds. The student is also responsible for any program fees, tests, or materials which are not covered by his/her scholarship.

Drop Policy

It is the student's responsibility to withdraw from a course that he/she cannot attend. Please note that failure to attend at least 75% of the course sessions, or failure to complete assigned coursework, may result in the termination of funding; as a result, the student will be charged for the entire cost of the course.

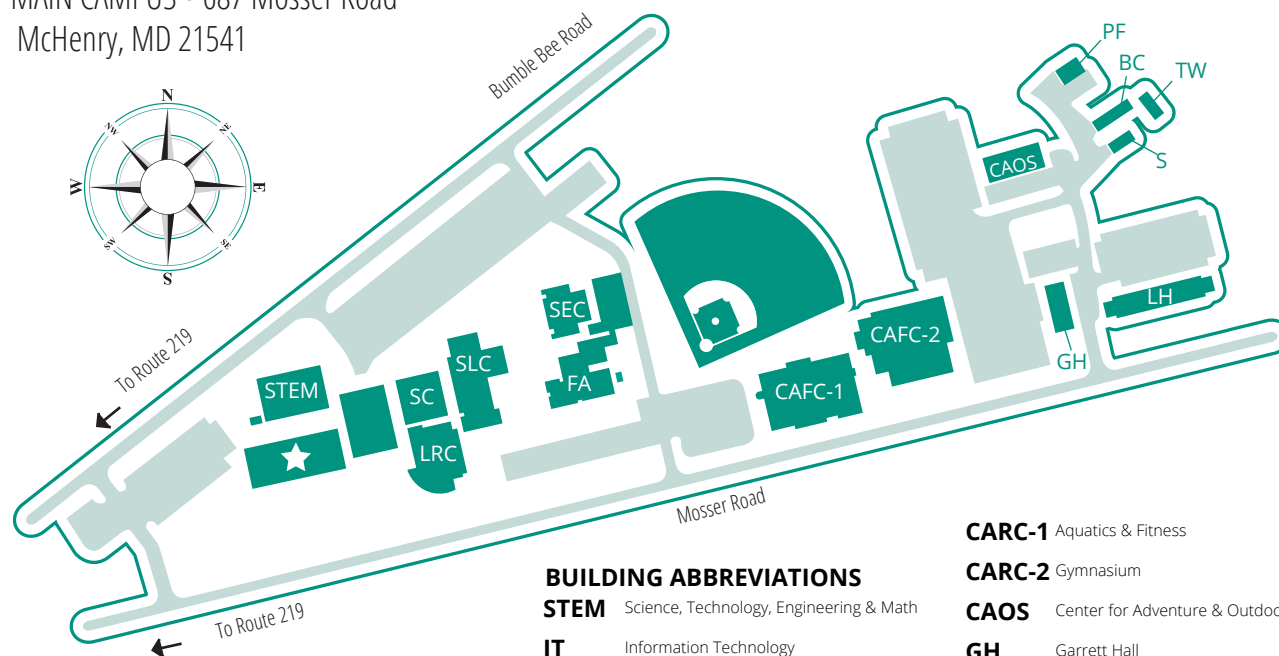

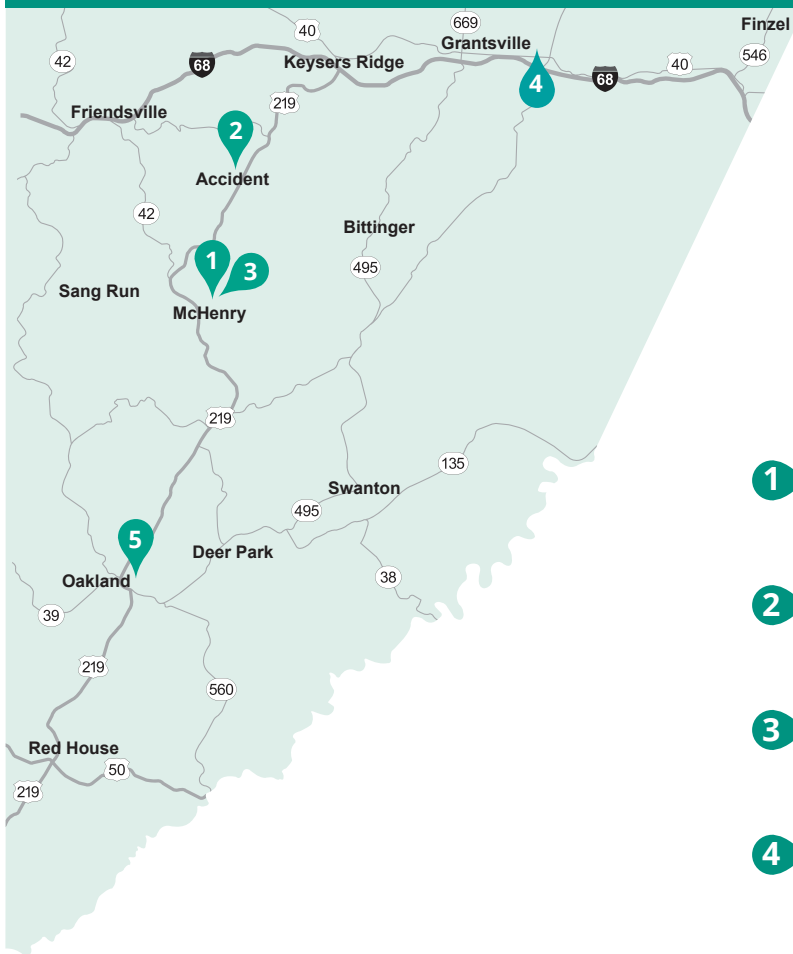

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Continuing Education and Workforce Development follows the Garrett College Inclement Weather Policy.

WHEN ARE WEATHER-RELATED DECISIONS MADE?

Because weather and road conditions can change quickly, there is no fixed time by which a decision to delay or close is made. While we attempt to make decisions for all-day closings and delayed openings by 6:30 AM, you should always consider the possibility that the decision may come after that time. Decisions to close early are made based upon information about the conditions, which means that there is no set time that these decisions will be made either; however, the College attempts to have a decision made about closing early by 3:00 PM.

HOW DO I FIND OUT IF THERE IS A DELAY OR CLOSING FOR THE COLLEGE?

The College's weather-line is immediately updated with any information that relates to the altering of the normal schedule.

HOW DO I KNOW WHICH LOCATION IS CLOSED?

Announcements made that the College is closed due to weather conditions include all locations: McHenry campus, Northern Outreach Center (Grantsville), Career and Technical Training Center (Accident), and the Southern Outreach Center (Oakland). There may be times when a particular location is delayed or closed for reasons other than weather. The information that is disseminated at that time will specify which location(s) are affected.

Employees, students and the public should not call any college department to find out whether the college is closed or is going to close. We ask that you call the weather-line for closing or delayed opening information.
