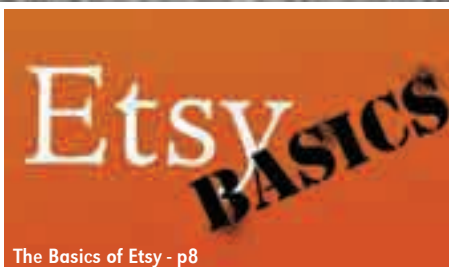

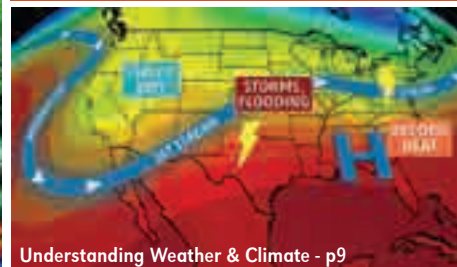

NEW! Contour Drawing PI-757

"Learning to draw is really a matter of learning to see - to see correctly - and that means a good deal more than merely looking with the eye." Kimon Nicolaides, 1891-1938. This course focuses on contour drawing as the central theme, but will also touch on modeling, shading and hatching techniques to define weight and mass. Students will be taught simple observational skills; how to recognize positive and negative space, in addition to composition and direction of light for shading and modeling. Contour drawing is a technique that involves the artist observing basic and simple outlines to quickly draw a subject. Contour drawings are used by most painters to sketch out the beginnings of paintings. No previous drawing skills or experience are required and all materials will be supplied by the instructor.

Beginner Landscape Painting PI-760

This course will introduce students to basic painting techniques and colors used in producing paintings in oil. Students will be introduced to principles of landscape painting, including composition, color values, structures and textures of natural form, and the application of general principles of art. No prior painting experience is required. Required materials: basic set of oil paints for landscape painting: Cadmium Red Deep Hue, French Ultramarine, Phthalo Blue, Viridian Hue, Permanent Green Light, Yellow Ochre, Burnt Sienna, Ivory Black, and Titanium White. (an example is Winsor and Newton Winton Starter set). Students will also need odorless paint thinner, a jar with a lid, a cloth, and various brushes including at least one of each: round, flat, filbert, and fan brush.

Designed for students who have previously taken a beginner knitting course, the intermediate class takes the basic skills of knitting to the next level. Students will increase their knowledge of knitting while working on specific knitting projects and patterns. The class will focus on the knitting process while incorporating new skills including knitting in the round, working lace using charts, following detailed scarf and shawl patterns, blocking, and maintenance of finished projects. Required course materials include 2 skeins of Lion Brand Wool Ease yarn in the color of their choice and 24 inch Bamboo needles (size 8/5mm, also used in the beginner class).

- Implement principles of good design - unity, simplicity, variety, movement, etc.
- Perspective - the use of colour, and techniques to make a small garden seem larger
- Select plant material for specific conditions - sun/shade, wet/dry, privacy, etc.
- Select suitable plants and materials that are aesthetically pleasing
- Maintain plants successfully using organic methods of pest and disease control
- Maintenance of plant material - watering, fertilizing, pruning, etc.
- Transformation of problem areas

Utah Concealed Firearms Permit Training PI-558

The Utah Concealed Carry Permit Certification Course allows you to be eligible to apply for a Non-Resident Utah Concealed Firearm Permit which is honored in 35 states; Maryland is NOT included. This five-hour class covers all aspects and requirements required by the state of Utah. In addition to successful completion of the course, you must also pass a criminal background check in order to obtain a permit. The Utah application will be completed as part of the course and reviewed for accuracy. Photographs and fingerprinting will also be done during the class at no additional cost. Please note that if your home state issues a concealed carry permit, you need to provide a copy of that permit to obtain your Utah permit. This does not apply to MD residents unless you currently have a permit. Fingerprinting, photography service & application packet are all included in the course fees. The permit fee (\$67) to the State of Utah (credit card or check) is NOT part of the course fee. Permit is valid for 5 years. THIS IS NOT A NATIONAL RIFLE ASSOCIATION (NRA) CLASS.

MD Handgun Qualification (HQL) PD-823

Handgun Qualification License training is a five-hour course including instruction on state firearm laws, home firearm safety, handgun mechanisms and operations, as well as demonstration of the ability to safely fire a handgun. Unless otherwise exempt, as of October 1, 2013, a Maryland Resident must possess a valid Handgun Qualification License before they may purchase, rent, or receive a handgun. Students must be a minimum of 21 years of age and are not permitted to bring a weapon or ammunition to class. Approved HQL training courses are offered by Maryland State Police approved Qualified Handgun Instructors. Training is valid for 3 years and must be completed prior to submitting an application for a Handgun Qualification License. The Handgun Qualification License is only needed for purchasing, transferring, or renting a regulated firearm after October 1, 2013. You do not need a Handgun Qualification License to own a gun you already have. Fingerprinting may be available (additional fee) depending on how many people register for the class.

CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT (CNA)

State of Maryland regulations require that anyone who performs nursing tasks, delegated by a nurse for compensation, must complete an approved Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) course of study and be certified by the Maryland Board of Nursing. The following two classes prepare you for your CNA certification. Those individuals who desire work in long-term care facilities (nursing homes) must, after completing the CNA course, also take the Maryland NNAAP registry test (written and skills) to become certified as a Geriatric Nursing Assistant (GNA). MEDICAL BILLING and CODING

The medical billing and coding profession is one of the fastest-growing careers in the healthcare industry today! The need for professionals who understand how to code healthcare services and procedures for third-party insurance reimbursement is growing substantially. Physician practices, hospitals, pharmacies, long-term care facilities, chiropractic practices, physical therapy practices, and other healthcare providers all depend on medical billing and coding for insurance carrier reimbursement. The medical industry will have almost 50% more jobs available by 2018; therefore, a surplus of medical facilities will continue to hire candidates who specialize in medical billing and coding.



ABOUT THE PROGRAM:

This billing and coding program delivers the skills students need to solve insurance billing and coding problems. It details proper assignment of codes and the process to file claims for reimbursement. With the transition to ICD-10, effective as of October 1, 2015, this course will also provide training in ICD-10-CM. This course covers the following key areas and topics:

- An overview of healthcare and insurance industry
- The organization and use of the ICD-9-CM, ICD-10-CM, CPT, and HCPCS manuals to identify correct codes
- Detailed review and practice using the alphabetic index and tabular list of the ICD-9-CM, ICD-10-CM, and practice coding examples within the CPT
- Basic claims processes for medical insurance and third-party reimbursements
- Completing common insurance forms, tracing delinquent claims, and appealing denied claims

PARAMEDIC

Paramedics are allied health professionals whose primary focus is to provide advanced emergency medical care for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system (EMS). Acting as a link from the scene to the healthcare system, paramedics function as part of the comprehensive EMS response, under medical oversight.

Garrett College's paramedic program is nationally accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs upon the recommendation of the Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for the Emergency Medical Services Professions. Continuing Education & Workforce Development offers the initial paramedic training program on a two-year cycle.

PROGRAM GOALS:

- Prepares competent entry-level Paramedics in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains, with an exit point at the Maryland CRTI level.
- After the first year and upon passing the NREMT I'99 exam, individuals will be eligible to sit for the Maryland Cardiac Rescue Technician (CRTI) exam to obtain state certification.
- After completing the second year of the program, students will be prepared to take the national and state certification tests to obtain their National Registered Paramedic (NRP) and Maryland Paramedic certifications.

TIME to COMPLETE PROGRAM:

- Two year training program
- Classes are held two evenings per week from 6:30-10:30 pm

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE:

- Minimum of 465 hours for the two year program
- Clinical hours are scheduled by the student outside of class

VETERINARY ASSISTANT

Veterinary Assistants aide in kennel care, assist veterinary technicians and veterinarians during exams of domestic animals and provide support throughout the veterinary office. They are employed in animal shelters, animal emergency centers, and veterinary practices. Instruction for the program is provided by a licensed Veterinary Technician and/or licensed Veterinarian. The program includes the following courses:

Veterinary Assistant One - Orientation to the Veterinary Profession

Veterinary Assistant Two - Outpatient Diagnosis & Treatment

Veterinary Assistant Three - Inpatient Treatment & Care

CERTIFYING PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION/AGENCY: This training program meets the National Association of Veterinary Technicians of America (NAVTA) guidelines and requirements for clinical experiences, certifications/licensing of instructors, and curriculum content.

SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION: Students will be prepared to work in an entry level position in an animal care facility and/or be prepared to continue training to earn an AA degree as a Veterinary Technician.

Child care professionals care for children in a variety of settings including schools, businesses, private households, and child care centers. They perform a variety of tasks including dressing, feeding, overseeing play, and age appropriate instruction.



CERTIFYING PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION/AGENCY: This program fulfills the 90-hour child care and 9 hour communication skills requirement through the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE).

TIME to COMPLETE TRAINING: The training can be completed in approximately 16 weeks. One 3 hour class per week and a minimum of 3 hours of independent/distance learning per week.

METHOD of INSTRUCTION: Child Care I, II, & III include class room instruction and distance learning. Class room instruction is used for Communication Skills for Child Care Professional.

Child Care- Growth & Development: This course satisfies the Child Growth and Development, 45 hour, half of the MSDE requirement of 90 hours for child care providers. The student will demonstrate an understanding of developmental stages and milestones from infancy through age twelve. They will gain an overview of the concepts and theories related to the social, emotional, physical, cognitive, and aesthetic stages of development; Demonstrate an understanding of major theories of child development; Identify methods of assessment and observation techniques used to observe and evaluate children; Demonstrate an understanding of the influence of culture and community on child development; Identify childcare regulations based on center regulations for staff; Explain how health and nutrition affect child growth and development; Demonstrate an understanding of inclusionary practices based on national standards and best practices in early childhood education and school age programs; Develop an understanding of how children learn; Define, demonstrate, and develop strategies for positive guidance and discipline by examining theory and best practices; Develop an understanding of the impact that family and parenting styles have on child growth and development; and Identify the signs of and reporting requirements and child abuse and neglect.

4.5 CEU's awarded. This is a required, pre-requisite course for all Child Care Training programs. Instructional materials are included.

Child Care- Group Care of Infant & Toddlers: This 45 hour course satisfies the curriculum half of the MSDE requirement of 90 hours for child care providers working with infants and toddlers. This course introduces the major concepts, principles, theories and research related to the development and care of children from birth to age three. BUS DRIVER TRAINING

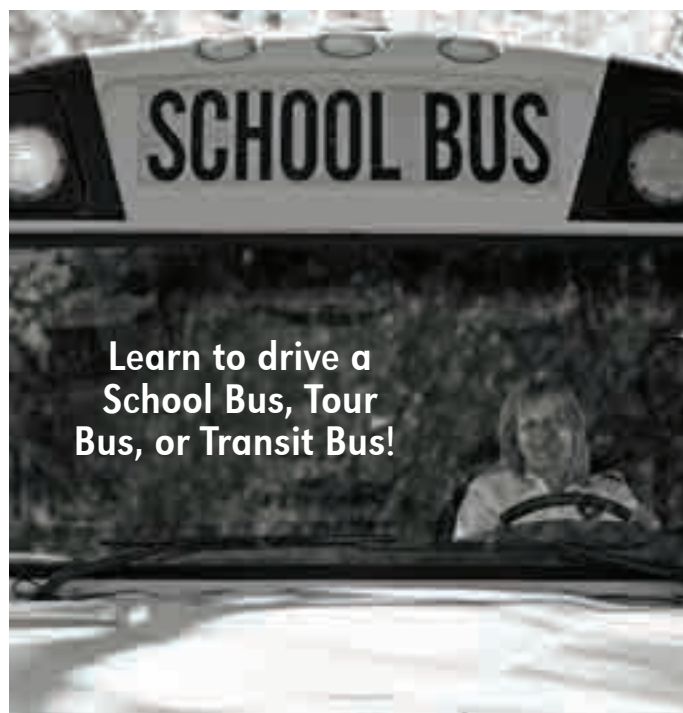
This training will cover the concepts and skills required for students to obtain their Class B Commercial Driver's License (CDL) with "P" (passenger) and "S" (school bus) endorsements. Topics include the following: vehicle inspection techniques, range skills, and over-the-road driving. Participants will concentrate on hands-on driving skill development including speed and space management, extreme driving operation, safe operating procedures and emergency maneuvers. At the completion of training, the student will be taken to demonstrate at their local Department of Motor Vehicles.

TIME to COMPLETE PROGRAM: Six day training that can be scheduled during the week or on weekends. Training will be one-on-one sessions.

LOCATION of TRAINING: Mountaintop Truck Driving Institute, Grantsville

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- A \$25 non-refundable registration fee is required from all students.
- High School Diploma is preferred, although not required.
- Department of Transportation (DOT) physical, drug screen and learners permit (to include passenger and school bus endorsements).

CDL LEARNER'S PREP

This two-day course will prepare students for the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA), Class A or B Commercial Driver written permit exam. The course includes instruction on the following topics: general knowledge, air brakes, combination vehicles, study and test taking skills. The course is taught through a combination of lecture, discussion, and hands on activities. It is recommended that students get a CDL Manual at the local MVA office and review prior to start of class. COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE (CDL), Class A

This skills-oriented program offers a professional truck driving curriculum for the purpose of qualifying students for entry level positions as drivers in over-the-road or local driving vehicles. Topics covered include the following: pre-trip inspection, various skills in the yard, and over-the-road instruction along with a basic overview of map reading and log books. At the completion of the training, the student will be taken to demonstrate at their local Department of Motor Vehicles to obtain a Class A license.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- A \$25 non-refundable registration fee is required from all students.
- Must currently possess a valid license and be 18 years of age.
- Must be able to pass a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical and drug screen.
- Must communicate in the English language sufficiently, as required by the U.S. Department of Transportation.

TIME to COMPLETE PROGRAM: Training will encompass 210 hours (30 days) of training and is offered in a weekday, evening, or a weekend setting.

COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE (CDL), Class B

With a Class B CDL, students can drive cement, gravel, delivery, refuse or similar vehicles allowing them to make a good salary, but also stay close to home.

This course will cover the essentials needed to obtain a Class B license including the following: pre-trip inspection, various skills in the yard, and over-the-road instruction along with a basic overview of map reading and log books. At the completion of training, the student will demonstrate at their local Department of Motor Vehicles to obtain a Class B license.



To expand, the Class B license allows an individual to operate any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) of 26,001 or more pounds; with any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of 10,000 pounds GVWR.

LOCATION of TRAINING: Mountaintop Truck Driving Institute, Grantsville

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- A \$25 non-refundable registration fee is required from all students.
- A current Department of Transportation (DOT) physical which cannot expire during the training period

Most courses have registration deadlines, which allows for ample time to notify students and instructors, should a course not meet its minimum enrollment. Garrett College's Continuing Education & Workforce Development division awards over \$100,000 in scholarships annually as a result of funding from Garrett County Commissioners, local agencies, and private donors through the Garrett College Foundation. Full and partial scholarships are available based on the applicant's residency, educational goals and financial need. For best consideration, students are encouraged to apply early! Scholarship applications must be submitted at least three weeks prior to the start of selected program for consideration.

All workforce programs require a \$25 non-refundable application fee which cannot be paid with scholarship funds. The student is also responsible for any program fees, tests, or materials which are not covered by his/her scholarship.

Drop Policy

It is the student's responsibility to withdraw from a course that he/she cannot attend. Please note that failure to attend at least 75% of the course sessions, or failure to complete assigned coursework, may result in the termination of funding; as a result, the student will be charged for the entire cost of the course.

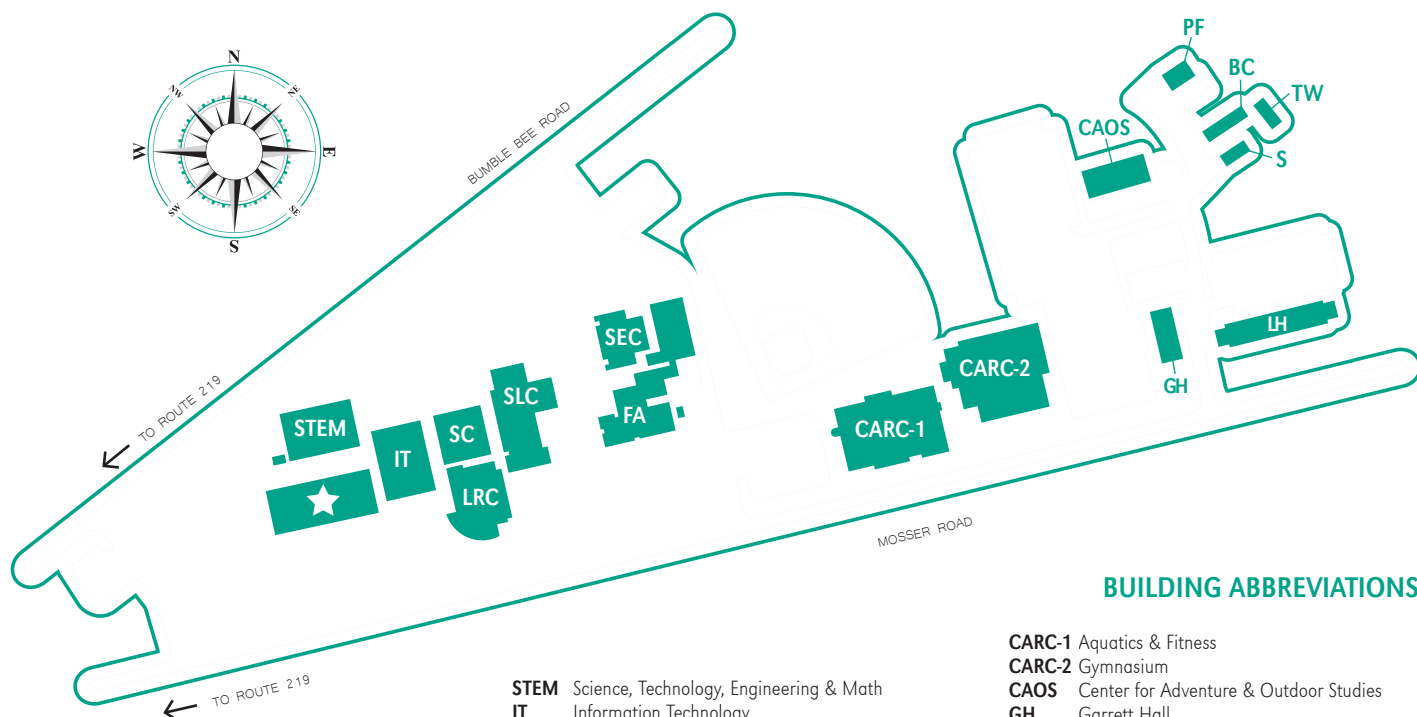

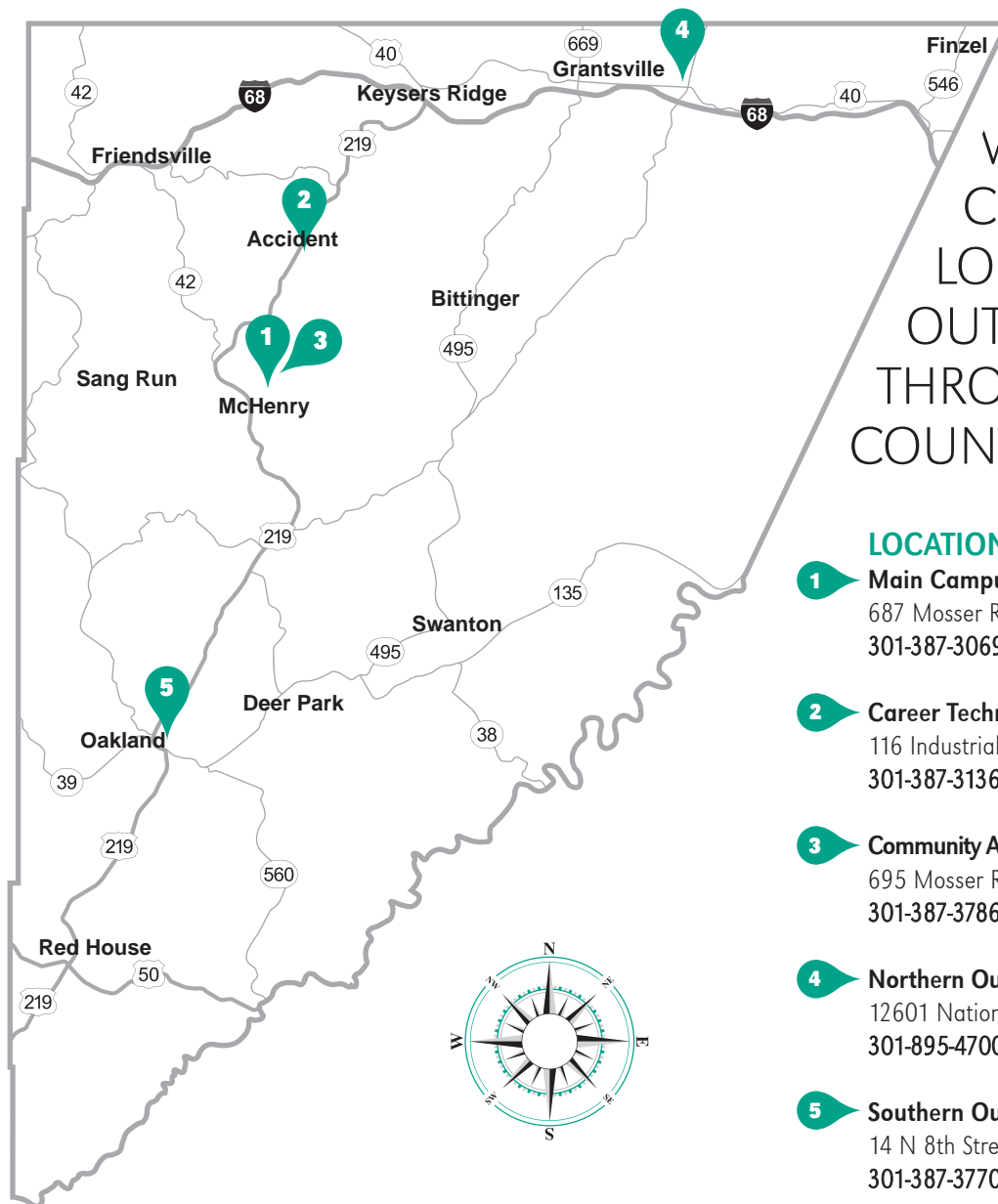

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

Continuing Education and Workforce Development follows the Garrett College Inclement Weather Policy.

WHEN ARE WEATHER-RELATED DECISIONS MADE?

Because weather and road conditions can change quickly, there is no fixed time by which a decision to delay or close is made. While we attempt to make decisions for all-day closings and delayed openings by 6:30 AM, you should always consider the possibility that the decision may come after that time. Decisions to close early are made based upon information about the conditions, which means that there is no set time that these decisions will be made either; however, the College attempts to have a decision made about closing early by 3:00 PM.

HOW DO I FIND OUT IF THERE IS A DELAY OR CLOSING FOR THE COLLEGE?

The College's weather-line is immediately updated with any information that relates to the altering of the normal schedule.

HOW DO I KNOW WHICH LOCATION IS CLOSED?

Announcements made that the College is closed due to weather conditions include all locations: McHenry campus, Northern Outreach Center (Grantsville), Career and Technical Training Center (Accident), and the Southern Outreach Center (Oakland). There may be times when a particular location is delayed or closed for reasons other than weather. The information that is disseminated at that time will specify which location(s) are affected.

Employees, students and the public should not call any college department to find out whether the college is closed or is going to close. We ask that you call the weather-line for closing or delayed opening information. Note: The College will not make an announcement if operating on a regular schedule. If no information has been posted, then the College will be operating as normal.
