It is a 1,600-acre preserve, one of the few remaining boreal bogs in the southern United States, and is unusual in harboring many plants and animals that are normally only seen in more northern climates.

HISTORY OF VIETNAM WAR INCLUDING 45 MINUTE FILM

Arguably, no conflict was more divisive for the United States, nor had more lingering effects on our national conscience, than the Vietnam War. Topics will include the history of Vietnam itself, opportunities lost that could have avoided the conflict, the U. S. strategies that led to escalation, and how the U.S. finally extricated itself from the war.
