2018 Mary Blair Whytsell Scholarship Application

Who is eligible?

An applicant must be a woman student who is (a) completing a degree program at Garrett College, (b) earning an AA at the end of the current spring semester (or in the fall semester of the year immediately preceding the current year), (c) and will be transferring into an accredited institution of higher education for the following fall semester to pursue a degree program leading to a BA or BS. She must arrange her own admission into a degree-seeking program at the institution of her choice and be accepted by the institution where she will pursue a bachelor's degree. This scholarship is intended to help a woman who has limited resources to continue her education. Applicants may not have received this scholarship previously and is available only while pursuing the undergraduate degree.

How much is the award?

A Mary Blair Whytsell (MBW) Scholarship awards the recipient approximately \$1,000 for the 2018-2019 academic year. The scholarship award is for book expenses and will be made payable to the recipient at the bookstore of the educational institution she attends. In some cases, reimbursement for online book purchase may be possible.

How are scholarship recipients chosen?

The Scholarship Committee of AAUW/Garrett County will review all applications. Incomplete applications will not be considered. If deemed necessary by the committee, qualified applicants may be invited for an interview. The recipient will be selected by the Scholarship Committee and her name will be sent to the Mary Blair Whytsell family for their records.

Scholarship awards are based on the following:

- An official transcript(s) showing proof of attendance and completion of the student's degree-seeking program of study at Garrett College that leads to the awarding of an AA degree.
- Proof of acceptance to an accredited institution of higher education in a degree-seeking status (i.e. not simply taking non-degree courses) in a program of study leading to a bachelor's degree.
- An essay of approximately 250 words describing the applicant's career goals and the financial and other obstacles that make reaching these goals difficult.
- One letter of reference from a faculty member or administrator who knows the applicant well.
- Membership in the AAUW-Garrett College Student Branch is taken into consideration.
- A completed Mary Blair Whytsell Scholarship Application.

What are the responsibilities of a scholarship winner?

She must attend the university/college to which she has been accepted in the fall semester following her acceptance of the award. She must be willing to be photographed and have her biography published locally for publicity purposes. Additionally, she must be willing to participate in at least one AAUW fund-raising or service project during the year after her acceptance. At the end of each semester, she will send to the Garrett AAUW Branch an accounting of book expenses and grades earned.

Deadline

The Scholarship Application and required documents must be submitted by April 27, 2018.
