

COVID-19 Weekly Update- Student (For November 20- December 3, 2021)

Current COVID-19 Status (August 1, 2021 through 10:00 am Friday, December 3, 2021)

- 151 reports (includes positive cases, symptomatic individuals, close contacts, and potential exposures)- +28 from last update
- 41 confirmed positive cases- +4 from last update
- 10 individuals are currently in isolation or quarantine either on- or off-campus

Garrett County COVID-19 Status (August 1, 2021 through 10:00 am Friday, December 3, 2021)

- Level of Community Transmission- High [no change from last update]
- Case rate of 64.0 per 100,000 [increased from last update]
- Positivity Rate of 15.8% (state rate is 5.44%) [county decreased, state increased from last update]
- Percentage of population (12+) fully vaccinated is **51.8%**

AS OF Friday, November 19, 2021, all individuals 18 years of age and older are now eligible for boosters.

Health and Safety Protocol Reminders:

- **Masks/face coverings** are **required** to be properly worn in all indoor locations (which includes common areas of the residence halls).
- Completion of the **Daily Health Self-Assessment** is required before coming to a campus location each day. The assessment can be found at <https://www.garrettcollege.edu/daily-health>.
- **Social distancing** of 3 feet is strongly recommended in crowded indoor and outdoor settings.
- **STAY HOME** when you are sick, awaiting test results, or have been identified as a close contact, until you have been cleared to return to campus.
- **Report** COVID-related illness, positive results, or close contact notifications to equitycompliance@garrettcollege.edu.
