- **ASAP | Buy your book(s) on eCampus**
<https://my.garrettcollege.edu/ics> Login, select Student tab, click Textbooks link. Have it shipped to your home or to wherever you'll be while taking the course.
- **December 21 | First day of class**
Log onto Blackboard and begin your class. Be sure to complete the assignment you have due this week or risk being dropped from the course. If you can't see your class in Blackboard, contact dlearn@garrettcollege.edu.
- **December 22 | Last day to drop the course**
- **December 23 - January 2 | Campus closed**
BUT your class is still in session; your instructor is your primary contact, available via email.
- **January 11 | Last day to withdraw (no refund)**
- **January 20 | Last day of class**

Frequently Asked Questions

- **When does my class start?** Class starts on Tuesday, December 21. You can find your class on Blackboard. Something will be due on the first day of class, so be sure to check your assignments..
