*MATH 150 or MATH 155 is a prerequisite course for WVU's John Chambers College of Business & Economics programs, and many courses. Though listed prior to the beginning of the third year, Garrett students may take it online through WVU at any time. It is recommended to be taken the summer following completion of MAT 105 (WVU's MATH 124). Students who can place into MAT 190 (MATH 155) at Garrett should attempt to complete the requirement prior to transferring to WVU.

Students must take the equivalent to WVU's ENGL 101 (ENG 101) and ENGL 102 (ENG 102) in order to satisfy the prerequisites requirement for BCOR 299.

**PSY 101or SOC 101 are not required for students intending to major in Economics. All other programs within the College of Business and Economics require one of these two courses. Students pursuing a degree in Economics may choose other Social Science electives.

- ^ To be admitted to the College of Business and Economics, students must have an overall GPA of 2.5. Students must also complete the following College of Business and Economics prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of C or better:
 - ACC 210 & 213
 - ECN 201 & 202
 - ENG 101 & ENG 102
 - MAT 105, 210, & 190 or MATH 150 (WVU)
 - CIS 105

Students completing this proposed pathway may choose to major within one of the following College of Business and Economics fields: Accounting; Economics; Entrepreneurship and Innovation; Finance; General Business; Global Supply Chain Management; Hospitality & Tourism; Integrated Marketing Communication; Management; Management Information Systems; Marketing; or Organizational Leadership.

Depending upon the student's choice of major, additional criteria for admissions must also be met:

- Accounting: A grade of B or higher in ACC 210 & 213; A minimum grade of C- in MATH 150 (WVU)
- Economics: One B or higher, and one C or higher in ECN 201 & 202; A minimum grade of B- in MATH 150 (WVU).
- Finance: A grade of B or higher in ECN 201 & 202; A minimum grade of B- in MATH 150 (WVU). A grade of C- in MAT 190.
- General Business: minimum grade of D- in MATH 150 (WVU) or MAT 190.
- Global Supply Chain Management: A minimum grade of B- in MATH 150 (WVU). A grade of C- in MAT 190.
- Hospitality & Tourism: minimum grade of D- in MATH 150 (WVU) or MAT 190.
- Entrepreneurship and Innovation: minimum grade of D- in MATH 150 (WVU) or MAT 190.
- Management: minimum grade of C- in MATH 150 (WVU). A grade of D- in MAT 190.
- Management Information System: minimum grade of B- in MATH 150 (WVU) or C- in MAT 190 or higher.
- Marketing: minimum grade of C- in MATH 150 (WVU). A grade of D- in MAT 190.
- Organizational Leadership: minimum grade of C- in MATH 150 (WVU). A grade of D- in MAT 190.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
