

## AP Score Requirements & Equivalancies

How credits may apply to a student's degree requirements is dependent upon the student's major; credits could potentially be used toward a General Education or Major requirement, or as an Elective credit. Credits can only be awarded toward one degree requirement.

To receive credit, an official score report must be sent directly to Garrett College.

A maximum of 45 non-resident credit hours including transfer credits, military experience, AP, etc., may be applied to a Garrett College associate degree. Degree-seeking students must earn at least 15 credit hours while in attendance at GC, and certificate-seeking students must earn at least 12 credit hours of their program at GC.

Students planning to transfer to other colleges/universities after Garrett College should contact those institutions to determine whether credits will be accepted upon transfer.
